Milwaukee, WI - The Charles Allis Art Museum's vibrant musical series *Allis After Hours* returns this season, featuring some of Milwaukee's best jazz musicians. The series continues on Thursday, May 20 with the musical talents of the Jamie Breiwick Quintet featuring Jamie Breiwick (trumpet), Patrick Breiner (tenor sax), Neil Davis (guitar), Aaron Darrell (bass), and Devin Drobka (drums).

Located just one block North of Brady on the corner of Prospect and Royal, (1801 N. Prospect Ave) this concert series features exciting, talented musicians from Milwaukee in the classic setting of the Charles Allis Art Museum. *Allis After Hours* will be held one Thursday a month from 5:30 p.m. – 8:30 p.m. in the Museum (moved outdoors into the English Garden during the summer).

Admission to *Allis After Hours* is free with paid admission to the museum (\$5/adult, \$3/students & seniors, free for museum members). Hors d'oeuvres are included, refreshments available for purchase. Visitors can also view the mansion, permanent collection and featured exhibition.

About Jamie Breiwick Jamie has been a fixture on the Milwaukee jazz scene for over a decade. He has shared the stage with such noted jazz artists as Rob Wilkerson, Dan Nimmer, and Rick Germanson. Breiwick has also performed with Grammy nominated R&B artist Eric Benet (featured in the videos for his hit singles "You're the Only One I Want" & "The Hunger"), the band Brazzaville (Barcelona), and comedian Bob Newhart. Breiwick is the adjunct trumpet instructor at Cardinal Stritch University, and the Wisconsin Conservatory of Music. Breiwick's debut CD "Song to a Rose" was selected by jazzreview.com jazz critic Paul Youngman as a top 10 pick for 2007.
